

Pregnancy and postpartum care and support from OSF OnCall Connect

When you're pregnant, it's important to get prenatal care beginning at week eight of your pregnancy. It's just as important to have continued support after your pregnancy. If you need additional support between doctor visits during your pregnancy or after pregnancy (postpartum), OSF OnCall Connect may be what you need.

What can you expect?

This safe, secure service is available at no cost to you. You will receive education and information through an easy-to-use app. There are also virtual check-ins using a chat feature in the app.

You can expect:

- Education and information for each week of your pregnancy
 - Regular check-ins by chat or phone
 - Clinical support from registered nurses or advanced practice providers who are specially trained to care for pregnant women and their babies
 - 24/7/365 access to the digital care team
 - Screening for postpartum depression
 - Information about breastfeeding, if needed
 - Review of needs you may have, such as transportation, food or housing
 - Support and information when it's convenient for you
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Are you eligible?

OSF OnCall Connect is available to women of any age in the state of Illinois who have Medicaid and are at least eight weeks pregnant or are in the first month of their postpartum time.

How do I enroll?

What happens after enrolling?

Once enrolled, a blood pressure cuff will be sent to you in the mail. You'll receive a phone call from a certified vendor to confirm your insurance information and determine what size of cuff you need.
